

# Memorandum of Understanding

## Signed with County and Tribe

On Tuesday May 12, 2009, The CDC, the Tribe and the Board of Supervisors signed a historic 3-way MOU (memorandum of understanding). The main points of the MOU are as follows:

- The Tribe will contribute up to \$496,000 from an ICDBG grant for the construction of the new fire station
- The County will contribute up to \$400,000 for the construction of the new fire station
- The CDC will convey approximately 15 acres of land at the mill site to the County
- The County will divide that land into 4 separate parcels
- One parcel will be used to build a new fire station for North Fork
- Two parcels will be given to the Tribe to develop their TANF office and future health and social services facilities for the community
- The fourth parcel will revert back to the CDC
  - This will result in the CDC having the ability to “spin off” and sell two parcels at the mill site
  - With lot line adjustments, these parcels can be created to suit the buyer
  - The proceeds from the sale of one or more parcels can be used to pay staff and keep the CDC operating
